

He loved cricket and computers.








His father Bukkapuram Nadella Yugandhar, was a government officer.

His mother Prabhavati Yugandhar, was a Sanskrit teacher.








After high school, he studied engineering, from Manipal Institute of Technology. He earned a degree in Electrical Engineering.










Later, he also got an MBA from the University of Chicago.

He believed tech and business go together.











In 1992, he joined Microsoft. His first job: Windows NT.








2011: He became head of Server & Tools.

He helped launch Microsoft Azure, the cloud platform.


Azure changed Microsoft's future.







2014: Satya became CEO of Microsoft. Only the third CEO after Gates and Ballmer.










His first big step: Shift focus to cloud computing and Al. He moved Microsoft away from only Windows.






2016: Launched Microsoft Teams. It grew fast, especially after 2020.








2016: Bought LinkedIn for \$26 billion. A bold move that paid off. LinkedIn kept growing.







2018: Bought GitHub for \$7.5 billion. Microsoft became a developer-friendly brand.






He rebuilt company culture.

He talks about his son Zain. Zain was born with cerebral palsy. That experience taught Satya empathy.











